A regular meeting of the Williamsport Mayor and Council was held on April 11, 2011, at the Williamsport Town Hall in Williamsport, MD at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor James G. McCleaf II called the meeting to order. Mayor McCleaf asked all in attendance to stand for a moment of silence followed by the pledge of allegiance.

A motion was made by Councilman Tim Fraker to accept the minutes of the regular meeting held March 14, the Special Meeting minutes from March 21, 2011, the minutes of the Workshop Meeting on April 4, 2011 and the Executive Session minutes from April 14, 2011. It was seconded by Assistant Mayor Anthony Drury with all voting in favor, motion carried.

Financial Report

Town Clerk, Donnie Stotelmyer presented the financial report for February. Councilman Tim Fraker made a motion to accept the financial report as presented, seconded by Assistant Mayor Anthony Drury, with all voting in favor, motion carried.

Guests

Mayor James G. McCleaf II introduced guest Tim Lung representing the Tour of Washington County Bicycle Race. Mr. Lung explained to the mayor and council that this year's race will be scheduled for Sunday June 19, 2011, it's the 4th year the event has taken place. It's sponsored by the Antietam Bello Club a 501-C6 charity. The first race starts at 11:15 am and the last race should finish by 4:30 pm. The course will remain the same and detours as last year.

Mr. Lung recommended posting No Parking signs on the effected streets after 9:30 am. He anticipates closing the effected streets at 10:30 am and reopening at 5:00 pm. The fire police and volunteer course marshals will be present to allow access to the residents who live in the inside of the course.

Councilwoman Maya Haines raised concerns about it being Father's Day weekend and about problems with the elderly residents on Vermont and Frederick Streets not being able to get
