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HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT & RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY

I, the undersigned, **DO HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE** that as a participant in the World War II Weekend event, I freely and voluntarily engage in a hazardous activity for my own recreation, enjoyment and pleasure. I recognize that, as a part of this activity, other participants and I may traverse difficult terrain and obstacles; temporarily occupy, enter and egress through abandoned buildings that may be in a variety of physical conditions; transport and care for explosive materials and devices; enter, exit, ride and use military type vehicles; transport and use various firearms and other weapons; and freely and voluntarily assume any and all risk of injury that such activities involve.

For these reasons, I HEREBY waive and release from liability and agree to hold harmless the following:

- 1. The Town, Mayor and Council and Museum Board members of Williamsport Maryland**
- 2. Mr. Kim L. Bowers, Event Coordinator, his relations, heirs, agents and/or representatives**
- 3. All owners and operators of participating vehicles, both modern and vintage that may be used to transport and move personnel on and about the location of this event, and/or that are utilized as part of the event's activities.**

for any and all damages of any kind or nature to my person and property arising out of or resulting from my direct or indirect participation in this event. I desire to participate at my own risk. I further represent that I will follow the event's Rules and all precautions necessary thereto.

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AMMO POLICY

1. All Blank Ammo Brought to the event will be in metal Boxes. or a closed container.
2. All units will have an designated or designee who will inspect their units respective blank ammo Friday night and/or Saturday morning prior to the battle scenario/weapons demonstration.
3. After the officers meeting, prior to deployment for the tactical all ammo designated officers from the units will concur with each other that in fact they have checked their units respective blank ammo.

A. All ammo taken to events should be in a Metal ammo box. Units might want to furnish them, no loose rounds in your gear bags. or boxes, no preloaded magazines. and when you get back home keep them in that box that way they wont get mixed in with real rounds, This is very simple for people to do and if ammo is in an ammo box its a better legal way to transport it that way the Police or an aware citizens will not have cause for alarm seeing hundreds of rounds in a trunk of a car, remember some of these rounds look real. I know most people who have a Right To Carry license, will have the real rounds in the car, and again this will help real rounds from being mixed in with the blanks.
*There will be exemptions for ammo belts.

B. Every unit will have a designated safety officer or someone else to do it whose job it will be when the re enactors get to the event especially for a Fri night tactical is to check the ammo ASAP. Do I need to mention new re enactors who are going to there first event? Besides the officers meeting there should be a ammo officers meeting were all the designated officers will concur with each other that they have checked there units ammo . and or put ammo checked on your registration card. or just check the ammo upon registration and stamp your card with inspected ammo card. For Those who do Field Police you might want to take this as your most important job checking registration cards with ammo checked .or just check ammo in the field or Make sure the Ammo Officer's did their Job.

C. No more body shots or in your face pointing with guns . This might also decrease the number of facial injuries due to powder burns and or injury from wood tipped blanks or bad crimps .Tell your soldiers to aim to the side of people or over or under.

* Bfongs are exempted and sub guns and machine guns, and tanks and planes but its a rule of thumb for one on one ground fighting.
